## **Guidance for HIV Services during COVID-19 pandemic**

The Ministry of Health through department of HIV and AIDS is mandated to offer policy guidance to public and private institution providing health services. This 4<sup>th</sup> edition circular provides updated implementation guidance to ensure continued effective HIV service delivery in Malawi while following COVID – 19 preventive precautions.

## **General technical guidance in Context of COVID-19 Pandemic**

- <u>A.</u> Resume delivery of HIV services: all health facilities to provide health services including
   HIV each day of the week upon fulfilling infection prevention procedures for COVID –
   19 listed below.
  - 1. All health providers always put on full personal protective equipment (PPE)
  - 2. Screen all patients before entering the facility for cough and fever. Both providers and clients should always wear face mask when providing and accessing services
  - 3. Provide a face mask to all clients with cough, investigate and manage them in a separate area as appropriate.
  - 4. Provide a hand-washing facility at all waiting areas. Enforce thorough hand washing with soap for at least 20 seconds for anyone before entering the facility.
  - 5. Wipe all objects and surfaces that are touched by many people such as doors, desks, chairs, etc. with disinfectant on a regular scheduled several times per day.
  - 6. Patients to gue at a distance of 1 metre apart.
- **B.** Resume all HIV related community services: Provide community health workers with personal prevention supplies (hand sanitizer, face masks and shields) to minimise physical contact with clients while offering services.
- C. HIV related training sessions: Conduct trainings when preventive precautions are followed. The trainings include Initial HTS, Skills Intensive, VMMC, Cervical Cancer, ART providers and Refresher, Advanced HIV Disease Management, etc. The precautions especially:
  - a. Limiting to 20 participants per session in well ventilated spacious room.
  - b. Temperature checks were done upon entry of each participant
  - c. Participants sit 1.5 meters apart, and were provided with face masks, hand sanitizer.

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The HIV program recommends general measures to avoid crowded facilities, reduce client time at the facility and to suspend non-essential services. This will contribute to minimize spread of COVID-19, free up health worker capacity for screening and management of potential COVID-19 patients.
